## **Proposals for the future development in North East Ashby to go on display**

Ashby-de-la-Zouch residents and businesses are this week being invited to comment on outline plans for a long-term development in Ashby of 600 new homes alongside a new health centre, extra care housing, primary school and a local employment area that will provide new jobs for the area.

Plans for development on land to the north of Nottingham Road, referred to as Money Hill, will go on show next week at a public consultation exhibition to be held at Ashby School on Nottingham Road. Invitations have been sent to over 4,000 properties in the area around the Money Hill site.

Money Hill has been identified by North West Leicestershire District Council as a broad location for future housing growth in the emerging Local Development Framework.

The promoters of the site, the Money Hill Consortium, will be holding drop-in public exhibition sessions on Friday **30 November, 4.30pm- 8pm** and on Saturday **1 December, 10am – 2pm**.

The exhibition, which will be on show at **Ashby School, Nottingham Road, Ashby-de-la-Zouch**, is open to all and visitors will be able to view the outline proposals for Money Hill and talk with members of the project team. The feedback received from visitors will help guide Money Hill Consortium's future plans for the site prior to submitting a planning application in 2013.

Matthew Inman, of Cogent Land LLP, a Money Hill Consortium partner said: *"As part of the Masterplan process, we have prepared an outline for the development; now we would like to hear the views of local people. We will take on board all comments and suggestions as to how we can best create a new vibrant community close to the town centre."*
